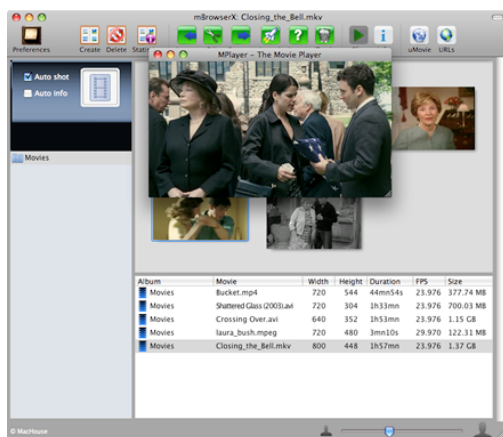


# mBrowserX (beta)

Thank you for your using mBrowserX.



To state briefly, mBrowserX is an advanced version of mBrowser. It uses ffmpeg to decode movies so that Auto shot can be used for a number of media formats beyond what mBrowser can handle. ffmpeg supports such media formats as AVI, DIVX, DV, FLV, MKV, MOV, MP4, MPEG, MTV, SWF, WMV (WMV7, WMV8, WMV9). But a bad side effect of using ffmpeg is that it can take half a minute or longer to make a movie profile.

mBrowserX also uses mplayer so that the user can play back movies free of QuickTime limitations. In order to play back a movie, select a movie thumbnail and simply click on the Play button. To quit, press Q. And use arrow keys to rewind and forward frames.

## 1. Indemnity

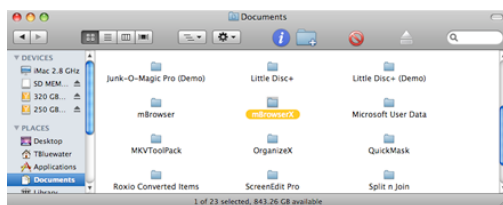

## 3. Installing mBrowserX

You can give it its own folder if you like, or just drag and drop a copy of mBrowserX anywhere even inside a USB drive. And you are all set.



## 4. Uninstalling mBrowserX

When launched for the first time, mBrowserX creates a folder containing a few files inside the **Document** folder, which you need to trash on top of the application file itself. You can find this folder easily by opening **Preferences**. Switch tabs to **System files** and then click on the **Open** button.

## 5. Using mBrowserX

This is a beta version of an upcoming commercial software title that is still under development. And there is no User Guide for it yet.
